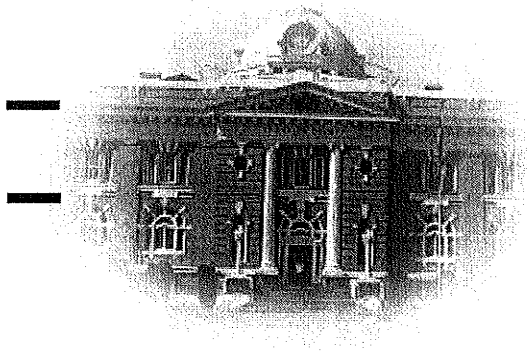
The Franklin County Planning Commission is a seven (7) member, non-paid, voluntary board that meets once a month in the evenings. The Commission makes recommendations to the Board of County Commissioners on land development applications, ordinance/code updates, and other land use related issues.

- Resume and/or Letter of interest.** Please include name, mailing address and contact phone number.
  
- Supplemental Questions.** Please briefly complete the supplement questionnaire. You may either handwrite or type the responses. Feel free to use additional pages as necessary. If you wish, the Planning Department can email (word document) you the questions and in turn you can complete the questions on a home computer.

- All above stated application materials must be submitted to be considered for the opening. This will need to be submitted to the Planning and Building Department no later than 5:00 p.m. on the last day of the advertised opening on the Commission.

# FRANKLIN COUNTY PLANNING COMMISSION

## SUPPLEMENTAL APPLICATION QUESTIONS

(Please BRIEFLY answer each question.  
You may either write or type in your answers)

1. Briefly, why did you apply to be on this Commission?
2. What is your understanding of what the Planning Commission is or does?
3. Do you think County government should adopt policies and regulations that control or restrict what people can do with their private property? Why?

4. Many Planning Commission actions can influence the value of a specific property, so the Planning Commission's process must be as fair as possible. Do you have any business interests or employment relations that could cause a conflict of interest with your role as a Planning Commissioner?

5. State law mandates both quasi judicial and legislative actions be heard by the Planning Commission.

To maintain an appearance of fairness, a planning commissioner----

- a) may not engage in discussion with the public or the applicant outside of a public hearing as it relates to quasi judicial site specific cases. Case file examples include Conditional Use Permits or Variances;
- b) may engage in discussion with the general public as it relates to legislative applications. Case file examples include Comprehensive Plan or Zoning Text changes.

How do you feel about not being able to freely discuss certain applications with the applicant or general public outside the context of a public hearing? Will you have a conflict with this law or a problem maintaining an appearance of fairness for Franklin County?
