9:03 a.m. Amending Chapter 5.14 Industrial Hemp Production

Planning and Building Director Derrick Braaten explained the background of the Industrial Hemp Ordinance in Franklin County. On February 22, 2020, Washington State Department of Agriculture's new rules went into effect through 16-306 WAC. Amending Chapter 5.14 of the Franklin County Code makes the county compliant with the state regulation of 16-306 WAC.

• Commissioner Peck moved to approve Ordinance 02-2020, repealing ordinance 03-2019 and amending Franklin County Code chapter 5.14, hemp and industrial hemp production, processing, transport and sales, regarding the permitting, siting and operation of hemp or industrial hemp production, processing, or wholesale/retail facilities, and designating hemp and industrial hemp as a protected farming operation in Franklin County, WA. Commissioner Didier seconded and the motion carried.
