REAPPOINTING PAMELA GILMORE, MIKE SULLIVAN, DAVE ALLAN, DAN SCHNEIDER TO THE FRANKLIN COUNTY HORTICULTURAL PEST AND DISEASE CONTROL BOARD FOR A TWO-YEAR TERM FROM FEBRUARY 1, 2020, THROUGH FEBRUARY 1, 2022

WHEREAS, The Franklin County Horticultural Pest and Disease Control Board Coordinator notified the Board of the need to appoint members to the Horticultural Pest and Disease Control Board; and

WHEREAS, Pursuant to RCW 15.09.030, each Horticultural Pest and Disease Board shall be comprised of five voting members, four of whom shall be appointed by the Board of County Commissioners; and

WHEREAS, Pam Gilmore, Mike Sullivan, Dan Schneider and David Allan have applied to serve as members of the Franklin County Horticultural Pest and Disease Control Board; and

WHEREAS, The Board of Franklin County Commissioners constitutes the legislative authority of Franklin County and deems this to be in the best interest of Franklin County;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED the Board of Franklin County Commissioner hereby appoints Pam Gilmore, Mike Sullivan, Dan Schneider and David Allan to serve as members of the Franklin County Horticultural Pest and Disease Control Board, each to, a two-year term from February 1, 2020 through February 1, 2022.

RCW 15.09.030**Members — Appointment — Terms.**

Each horticultural pest and disease board shall be comprised of five voting members, four of whom shall be appointed by the board of county commissioners and one of whom shall be appointed by the director. In addition, the chief county extension agent, or a county extension agent appointed by the chief agent, shall be a nonvoting member of the board.

Of the four members appointed by the board of county commissioners, one of such members shall have at least a practical knowledge of horticultural pests and diseases, and the other members shall be residents of the county, shall own land within the county and shall be engaged in the primary and commercial production of a horticultural product or products. Such appointed members shall serve a term of two years and shall serve without salary. If no such qualified candidate resides in the county, a nonresident that owns property in the county and is engaged in the primary and commercial production of a horticultural product or products may be appointed as a member of the horticultural pest and disease board.
